From our Pastor:

One of my favorite books in the Bible is the book of Ephesians. It is a treasure trove of wisdom, encouragement, and guidance that speaks powerfully to us today, just as it did to the early Christians in Ephesus.

Ephesians begins with an exploration of the spiritual blessings we have in Christ (Ephesians 1:3-14). Paul reminds us that we are chosen and redeemed by God's grace. He highlights the immeasurable love God has for us, a love that predates the foundation of the world. In these verses, we are reminded of our identity in Christ – an identity rooted in grace, love, and divine purpose.

One of the central themes of Ephesians is unity. Paul speaks of the unity of the church, a body of believers from diverse backgrounds and cultures, all brought together through Christ (Ephesians 2:11-22). This unity is not merely a call to coexist peacefully but to actively love, support, and grow with one another. It is a call to break down barriers and build bridges, reflecting the reconciliation we have received through Jesus.

In Ephesians 4:1-16, Paul shifts his focus to the practical outworking of this unity. He urges us to live a life worthy of our calling, characterized by humility, gentleness, patience, and love. He speaks of the diversity of gifts within the body of Christ, each one given for the building up of the church. This diversity should not lead to division but to a richer, more vibrant community where each member contributes to the growth and health of the whole.

Paul also provides clear guidance on how to live out our faith in everyday life. In Ephesians 5:1-21, he exhorts us to be imitators of God. He gives practical advice for relationships – between husbands and wives, parents and children, and masters and slaves – emphasizing mutual respect, love, and submission (Ephesians 5:22-6:9). These teachings remind us that our faith should permeate every aspect of our lives, transforming our relationships and interactions with others.

As we navigate the spiritual battles of life, Paul explains how we are equipped with the armor of God (Ephesians 6:10-18). He describes the full armor we need to stand firm against the schemes of the devil: the belt of truth, the breastplate of righteousness, the shoes of the gospel of peace, the shield of faith, the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit. This vivid imagery underscores the reality of spiritual warfare and the divine protection and empowerment we have in Christ.

We will hear readings from Ephesians throughout July and August. I encourage you to delve deeply into this book. Reflect on its teachings, meditate on its truths, and allow it to transform your heart and mind. Let us strive to embody the unity, love, and purity that Paul speaks of, building a community that reflects the glory of God.

Noisy Bucket Mission of the Month **Heat for Heroes**

In the middle of the summer, you might not be thinking about being able to heat your house. But for many of our local veterans, staying warm during the winter can be a significant challenge. That's where the "Heat for Heroes" program steps in, providing essential heating assistance to those who have bravely served our country.

Heat for Heroes is a dedicated initiative aimed at ensuring that veterans and their families have access to heating resources during the harsh winter months. This program, a part of the Keep Wisconsin Warm/Cool Fund, offers financial assistance for heating bills, energy efficiency improvements, and emergency fuel deliveries to veterans in need.


Many veterans face financial hardships that make it difficult to afford basic utilities, including heating. According to their website, 62,000 Wisconsin veterans have to choose between food and heat. After dedicating their lives to protecting our freedoms, it is our duty to ensure they do not have to struggle to stay warm. Heat for Heroes not only helps keep veterans warm but also provides peace of mind, knowing that their community stands behind them.

Veterans in need can apply for assistance through the Heat for Heroes website or by contacting the program directly. Applications are reviewed to ensure that applicants meet the eligibility criteria, which includes proof of veteran status and financial need. Approved applicants receive financial support to cover their heating bills or to make necessary repairs and improvements to their heating systems.

Since its inception, Heat for Heroes has made a significant impact in the lives of many veterans. Last year alone, the program assisted over 1,500 veterans in Wisconsin, ensuring they had the necessary resources to stay warm throughout the winter.
