"Give joy"

As I was reading through my emails the other morning, one from Margaret Feinberg caught my attention. I've used some of her Bible study materials and find them refreshing and hopeful. In her email, she shared the following story and I thought maybe it would speak to you as well.

"A few years ago, I wrote a book about joy where I tell the story of returning to the chemo ward for yet another brutal round of treatment. It was more than I could handle.

"I swung by a local party store on our way to the infusion center. My right hand clutched a bundle of red balloons. Intent on passing them out, I approached the long corridor of chairs filled with infusion patients . . .

A frail woman occupied the first chair.

"My name is Margaret, and I've had a really difficult time in treatment. I'm in the fight of my life," I said. "I don't want to be here today, and I bet you don't either. I want to give you this red balloon in hope that it would bring you joy."

The woman smiled as she extended her arm: "I'd like that."

Turning to the man next to her, I repeated my offer, but with a different result.

"Not now," he said with bone-tiredness, "but thank you very much."

I approached the woman across from him.

"I don't need a balloon, but I do need a hug," she preempted.

I reached down and wrapped my arms around her neck. The man who rejected my balloon cleared his throat, interrupting our moment.

"Wait," he protested. "I didn't know you were giving away free hugs."

I wrapped my arms around him, too.

One by one, I shuffled my way down the row, introducing myself and handing out balloons for nearly an hour. By the time I finished giving them all away, I had been inflated with just enough courage to take my seat and face the suffering that would come. That's when I discovered:

Joy is a gift we can offer even when we don't possess it ourselves.

When we give it away freely, something mysterious happens: Joy multiplies.

Jesus says, "Give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, will be poured into your lap. For with the measure you use, it will be measured to you" (Luke 6:38).

I always thought of the container as something external we hold as we watch it being filled, pressed down, shaken, and filled up more. I never considered that we are the containers. God fills us.

One of the best ways to receive joy is to give joy.

Like me, you may not always feel like it. The day you need joy most may be the one you want to offer it the least.

Give anyway and give generously.

Take the leap.

Slip a grumpy store clerk a kind word of thanks. Give that friend who's always down on herself a compliment. Flash a smile to strangers who seem to be having a hard day. Drop off a surprise bouquet. Send a card. Hand out a balloon. Offer a five-second hug. Then wait to see what kind of fruit these seeds of joy bear.

As you pour joy into others, joy will be poured into you."

Blessings to you friends as we begin this new year. May we be people who pour joy into others!

January Mission of the Month - Out Today Help Me Be Okay

Last fall, at a We ARE in Christ meeting (which includes representatives from Waushara County churches and other community leaders), it was noted that there have been several individuals in the Wautoma area this past year who are homeless. Some of these homeless individuals have been released from prison without any family to help them or any resources to start over.

One individual was transported and dropped off by the prison they were released from, without any other assistance. The individual was still in his orange prison jumpsuit and had an expired prison ID. Any attempts he made to cash a check (his remaining prison commissary funds) was rejected as he did not have a valid ID. Without money, he could not apply for a new valid Wisconsin state ID. Quite a Catch-22 situation. Also walking around in his prison orange jumpsuit evoked plenty of reactions from people who saw him and reached out to the police department. Local law enforcement had no funds to get any clothing for the individual so he could change out of his prison jumpsuit, nor did they have any way of providing him with some food or shelter. Eventually, he was driven to Oshkosh and an overnight shelter was found to take him in.

The members of We ARE in Christ recognize that for these inmates to begin to assimilate into society they need some basic clothing, a state ID or driver's license, a place to stay, food, and personal hygiene items. We ARE in Christ in cooperation with local law enforcement are seeking to provide much-needed assistance in this area by providing local law enforcement with gift cards and vouchers that can be used and redeemed for clothing at local thrift stores, food, and the cost of securing an ID or Driver's License when they are made aware that a former inmate is released in Waushara County. Such assistance reduces recidivism.

We ARE in Christ

Just before Thanksgiving, a woman was dropped off from out of town only wearing one shoe. The police chief, with funds from "Out Today" was able to help her get a pair of shoes and with help from human services found a place for her in a hotel until family could pick her up.

Our January mission focus is to collect funds to support the Out Today Help Me Be Okay fund.

Matthew 25:37-40: Then the righteous will answer him, "Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you?" The King will reply, "I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did it to me."





Serving will begin at 8:00am. If you need a ride – reach out to another attendee.








The Poy Sippi Community Food Pantry News:

November 14, 2023 at 6:30pm

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by President Mark Henn at 6:30PM.

Devotions: Pastor led in prayer.

Visitors: No visitors.

Approval of minutes: Concerning the CD-the wording needed to be changed from emergency to reinvestment. Motion made, seconded and carried as corrected.

New Business:

- A. Financial Ministry Software: The software in use now costs \$303.00 annually. Icon software offers more options for the finance committee. The cost is \$462.00 annually. A motion was made, seconded, carried to purchase this new program.
- B. Remove procedure for HND from policies: All policies for the HND are void. It was brought up that the insurance for the church needs to be updated and/or check into other companies.
- C. Procedures for and duties for Financial Ministry: To be added to the constitution 13.06A21 Finance Ministry. Motion made, seconded, 13.06A23 carried. Also 13.07E21 to be added to the constitution. Motion made, seconded, 13.07F23 carried.
- D. Proposal of Bookkeeper position: After discussion, motion was made and seconded to have a bookkeeping position. Mark will post it. A motion was made and seconded to purchase a computer for the bookkeeper. The funds will come from the general fund. That motion carried.



Unfinished Business:

- Suggestion Box: The computer in the sanctuary needs replacing. Motion made and seconded to purchase a new computer, funds will come from Sound Technology Designated Funds. The old computer will be used by the Archive Committee.
- 2. Archive Storage: Kevin is going to do some pricing on fireproof safes.
- 3. Handling of Money policy/instructions: Tabled til December meeting
- 4. Lent Worship Services: No decisions are made yet
- 5. Update on Flooring: No updates at this time
- 6. Update on blacktop bids: "Wolf River Asphalt" is being looked into.
