Over the past couple of weeks, I have been reading through the book of Exodus. You may recall that this book of the Bible talks about how the Israelites were slaves in Egypt until God heard their cries for help and rescued them from their bondage. Moses led these people out of Egypt and towards a place God promised to them. God did all kinds of miraculous things to show God's power and strength. God sent plagues of various kinds, God led the people with a pillar of cloud by day and fire by night, and God parted the red sea so they could walk through on the dry ground.

But they weren't out of Egypt very long before the people began complaining that they didn't have water or food. God heard their cries and met their needs. God provided water from a rock, God sent quail for their supper, and provided manna for them to eat. They had to gather this manna every morning (except on the Sabbath) and there was enough for everyone's needs.

The people couldn't create this bread for themselves, they could only gather it. At first, a few tried to keep some of this bread overnight only to find it filled with maggots the next morning. They had to receive it each day. The lesson they had to learn was that God would provide for their needs – but one day at a time.

I read a story about a family that adopted a little boy from Russia. They got him when he was about 1-1/2 years old. One day they discovered in his crib hunks of food from their last several night's suppers. He was eating well at the table, so they were confused as to why he carried his food to his crib. Finally, they realized that where he came from, he didn't know from one meal to the next if there would be more. So, he would hoard. He had learned by 16 months, to take extra food, stick it in his clothing, and stash it in his crib. He hadn't yet learned to trust that every day his new parents would feed him again. Every day they would provide for his needs. Soon, he did learn to trust. He learned that he had parents who would provide, and he stopped carrying food to his crib.

When manna was given in the wilderness, the Israelites were permitted to gather only as much as they needed for that day (except for the day before Sabbath). This made it necessary for them to rely on God day by day. In Deuteronomy, we're told, "[God] did this to humble you...so you would never think that it was your own strength and energy that made you prosperous" (Deuteronomy 8:17).

As I read these accounts in Exodus, I am reminded that God has been faithful, is faithful, and continues to be faithful. I might not be able to see the whole picture, but each story reminds me to trust God. Each story encourages me to step out in faith trusting that God will provide for my needs today and each day yet to come.

Sunday School

We are excited for a new Sunday School year to begin on September 10th at 9:00am. There will be two classes offered this year.



The younger students ages 3 through 1st grade will follow the weekly lectionary using the Whirl student books and materials.

The older students 2nd grade through 6th grade will be receiving Spark Bibles during worship on September 10th. They will be using these Bibles each week as they study the Bible using the Spark classroom materials.

Youth Ministry

Pastor is looking for some folks who would be interested in forming a youth ministry committee to help us reach out to high school and middle school youth. If you would be interested in serving in this area, please talk with pastor Rebekah.

A grandfather was walking through his yard when he heard his granddaughter repeating the alphabet in a tone of voice that sounded like a prayer. He asked her what she was doing. The little girl explained: "I'm praying, but I can't think of exactly the right words, so I'm just saying all the letters, and God will put them together for me, because He knows what I'm thinking."

We are the church together:

When I was a kid back in Sunday school, I remember learning a song that included these words "I am the church, you are the church, we are the church together." I wonder if sometimes we forget that we are the church and that each of us has a role to play in helping us, the church function. When it comes to our Sunday worship services, there are several different roles involved in planning, setup, leading, and serving. Training is provided where needed or requested and kids are welcome to participate.

Here are some of the ways you could help.

Greeter - stands by the main entrance door for about a half hour to greet everyone who arrives for worship. This friendly face may be the first person a guest sees on Sunday morning.

Bread Baker - makes bread for communion. There are a couple of different recipes available that you can use if you don't have a favorite recipe.

Altar Guild - two people are assigned a month to set up communion before each Sunday worship and clean up following the service.

Communion Assistant - one person each month to help the pastor serve communion at the rail. One person serves the wine and the other follows with the empty tray to collect the empty cups.

Reader - proclaims the scriptures during our worship service. This usually includes an Old Testament reading, leading the responsive psalm, and a New Testament reading. The readings are provided in advance to allow time to practice.

Acolyte - lights the candles before worship and extinguishes them following worship.

Coffee & Fellowship Host - provides refreshments, makes coffee, and serves the coffee and refreshments prior to the Sunday worship service.

If you are interested in serving in any of these roles, talk to pastor Rebekah or let Patti know in the office.









Polka Service ~ Sunday, October 1st at 10:30AM!





July 11, 2023

Attendance: Mark Henn, Kevin Birschbach, Lenny Langkau, Jan Strehlow, Joan Everson, Jerry Wrage, Dar Cravillion, Pastor Rebekah Tarras, Intern Kathy Cartwright.



Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by President Mark Henn at 6:02PM.

Devotions: Each council member read a prayer ending with Pastor Rebekah.

Visitor(s): No visitors. Mark read a thank you note that came from Amanda Dalton. She received the small red table and chairs that were stored at the HND.

Approval of Minutes: Motion made, seconded and approved corrected minutes.

New Business:

- A. St. John's Saxeville 125th anniversary: After discussion, Dar will talk with the Pastor at St. John's for suggestions. Up to \$200.00 from designated memorial interest will be used for purchase of a gift.
- B. Winter Bingo: Mark and Connie Henn will be part of the committee, Mark will ask for one more person from the congregation to help.
- C. Suggestion Box: This box will be available Sunday for persons to drop in suggestions they may have for monies coming from the sale of the HND.
- D. Letter from Jaci Boening concerning hearing loop: A letter was read. She also sent information on a company that installs this hearing loop. Lenny is checking into it and getting prices to bring to the August Council meeting.

Unfinished Business:

- 1. House Next Door updates: Mark said the closing will be earlier than the August 3rd date that we had previously. Possibly July 19th or July 31st. Mark will inform the council members when the closing will take place. A motion was made and seconded to deposit the check from the sale of the HND into the General Fund Account. Motion carried.
- 2. Shed update: A "Land use Permit" was applied for and received. It is posted on the front of the church.
- 3. Calling Tree update: Joan has completed the form and a copy of it will be given to council members who will be able to contact congregation members in case of inclement weather.
- 4. Counting Committee: Dar has been working on updating the policy for the counters. Dar also talked about a Deposit Box/Lock Box to be installed for the giving envelopes to be put in. Mark and Connie would purchase this box. Motion was made and seconded to proceed with purchase. Motion carried.

Other Business: Lord's Acre Stand: Mark will call Mark and Tammy Kretzmann to see if they will be interested in tending to the stand again this year. Insurance: As soon as the closing takes place on the HND, the insurance can be canceled. We will also have to pick up insurance on the shed when it arrives.

<u>Monthly Financials</u>: There was confusion on the report. Pastor will talk with Diane and bring it to next month's council meeting.

Parish Council Committee: Upcoming Events - Worship in the park & picnic in Berlin July 23rd 10:00am.. Grace will cover the cost of the shelter, meat, buns and tableware. There is no service at First that day.

Noisy Bucket: July is Poy Sippi Betterment Committee, August is Welcomed (foster care), September is P.S. Food Pantry, October Lutheran Disaster Response, November - Honor Flight (\$500 will sponsor one veteran), December - ELCA Good Gifts.

Children's Ministry Committee: VBS was canceled this year for lack of children signed up. We have 3 children attending camp this year. Monies for these campers will come from the Maxine Leone memorial, Designated Youth fund, Endowment and General Fund. \$885 total.

Worship: Technology: it was reported that everything is working well at this time.

M-Team: Potluck July 30th after worship. Legacy August 13th, Polka Service Oct. 1st with potluck.

Endowment Fund Committee: Meeting is scheduled for August 1st 6:30 pm at First.
