#### From Pastor Rebekah:

As I was preparing for worship in the park, the words from Psalm 139 stood out to me. They are such beautiful and reassuring words. Verses 7-10 in particular stood out to me.

Where can I go from your spirit?

Or where can I flee from your presence?

If I ascend to heaven, you are there;

if I make my bed in Sheol, you are there.

If I take the wings of the morning

and settle at the farthest limits of the sea,

even there your hand shall lead me,

and your right hand shall hold me fast. Psalm 139:7-10

Isn't that an incredible statement of faith? There is no place we can go that God is not. One of the books I enjoy sharing with my grandchildren is Margaret Wise Brown's book, The Runaway Bunny. It is a book for children of all ages. The story is about a little bunny who dreams about running away from home, only to find "home" wherever he ends up. His mommy does not stop him from running away, but she does not leave him either. When he climbs a tree, the tree is in the shape of Mommy. When he travels the ocean, the wind is in the shape of Mommy. When he joins the circus, the trapeze artist is shaped like Mommy. Finally, little Bunny gets the point. "Aw, shucks!" he says, "I might just as well stay home and be your little bunny." Which he does.

Like the little bunny in the story, we will never find ourselves out of God's presence. We cannot run away from God. God is our home and is with us wherever we go. Whatever the circumstances of our lives, God is with us – in peace, in war, in hope, in fear, in joy, in suffering, in sickness, in health, in life, in old age, and even in death. Wherever we live, wherever we work, wherever we go God is forever with us.

Friends, where ever you find yourself today, in whatever situation you are facing, God is with you.

# The Library Lion


This month the Library Lion would like to let you know there is a set of books donated by Marcella Jorgensen that is a

## 2023 August Mission of the Month: Welcomed (foster care)




Surrounding vulnerable children, and the families who support them, with caring communities.

"Taking the child in his arms, he said to them, "Whoever welcomes one of these little children in my name welcomes me; and whoever welcomes me does not welcome me but the one who sent me." – Mk 9:36-37

#### Did you know?

- Nearly 400,000 children in the US need foster care. In Wisconsin in 2022, that included 7,066 children in need of foster care.
- Over 60% of American children caught up in sex trafficking came out of foster care?
- In some states over half of prison inmates come from the foster care system?
- The majority of girls who age out of the foster care system become pregnant within 2 years perpetuating the cycle of generational poverty.
- Of those who age out of the system, 20% are instantly homeless, and 40% are homeless within 18 months.
- Children who are placed in homes with a family that provides consistent and sincere love, nurturing, accountability, and hope, face a much better outlook.

Welcomed Family Advocacy Ministry partners with local churches to become a force for good in their local community to invest in the well-being of local foster families. Not everyone can foster, but everyone can do something:
