From the Pastor:

Dear Beloved Church Family,

In the weeks following Easter, our Epistle readings come from the First letter of John. It's a short letter, but one that is worth spending some time in and reflecting on because it contains a lot of insight for living our lives as Christians. One of the words that I noticed repeated several times in this letter (18x) is the Greek word μένω (menō) translated as abide or sometimes as remains or resides.

What does it mean for us to "abide in God"? The Greek word μένω (menō) indicates a close, intimate, and permanent relationship between the believer and God. It is very important to note that for the author of the Gospel of John and the Johannine epistles, every genuine Christian has this type of relationship with God.

In the Gospel of John 15:4-5, Jesus says, "Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. I am the vine; you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing."

Abiding in God is about cultivating a deep and intimate relationship with our Heavenly Father, allowing God's love to transform us from the inside out. This kind of deep relationship with God doesn't just happen, it takes some intention on our part. Abiding in God is a conscious decision to surrender our will to God. We cultivate this relationship through regular prayer, reading scripture, worship, and fellowship with other believers.

When we abide in God, we find strength in our weakness. In times of trial and adversity, God's grace sustains us, God's peace calms us, and God's presence empowers us to persevere. As the psalmist declares, "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble" (Psalm 46:1).

Abiding in God also brings us peace that surpasses understanding. In a world filled with turmoil and uncertainty, God's presence is our anchor, grounding us in God's unchanging truth and promises. As we abide in God, He guards our hearts and minds with His peace (Philippians 4:7).

Moreover, abiding in God gives us purpose and direction. When we align our lives with God's will, we discover the unique calling God has placed on each of us. Whether it's serving others, sharing the Gospel, or simply reflecting God's love in our daily interactions, we find fulfillment and joy in bearing fruit for God's kingdom.

Dear friends, as you abide in God, may you draw from God's strength and be filled with God's peace.

Holy Humor Sunday – April 7


What is Holy Humor Sunday?

It has a long history in many congregations around the world. Churches in 15th century Bavaria used to celebrate the Sunday after Easter as Risus Paschalis (God's Joke, or the Easter Laugh).

Priests would deliberately include amusing stories and jokes in their sermons in an attempt to get their congregations to laugh. After the service, people would gather together to play practical jokes on one another and tell funny stories. It was their way of celebrating the resurrection of Jesus – the supreme joke God played on Satan by raising Jesus from the dead. The observance of Risus Paschalis was officially outlawed by Pope Clement X in the 17th century.



Perhaps people were having too much fun! In 1988 the Fellowship of Merry Christians began encouraging churches to resurrect some of these Christian traditions – to celebrate the grace and mercy of God through the gifts of laughter and joy. G.K. Chesterton once wrote, "Angels can fly because they take themselves lightly. He who has the faith has the fun."








"Power Lines" by Jason





This is a story of a community's quest to dissolve barriers in the aftermath of Nelson Mandela's regime-shattering election. Armed with a knowledge of both Zulu and Siswati he traveled the countryside, immersing himself in the lives of blacks and whites alike.

In the process, he found many on both sides who were eager to reach out to each other and heal wounds. Shaping his unique experiences into a powerful story, Carter demonstrates that even in a society as fragmented as South Africa, the people's desire to come together can still triumph.

We went to the Bethany annual meeting on February 25th as the delegates from First Lutheran Church of Poy Sippi.

They talked about how Covid has closed several facilities in the surrounding cities and has negatively impacted their staff turnover rate.

They also shared their list of current needs such as:

- revamping the chapel to accommodate the growing campus
- purchasing a new truck for the maintenance department
- assistance with replacing the roof on the old part of the building
- finding ongoing entertainment for the residents
- finding volunteers to assist with activities
- the need for new windows and doors
- assistance with replacing a tub in the CBRF
- new mattresses
- redoing bathrooms in the CBRF
- updating call light system and
- purchasing tablets and/or laptops



Currently they have 30 rooms open in the nursing home and there are 140 people on a waiting list for a room at Shadow Woods.

We discovered that Bethany Home can also hold presentations for congregations such as diabetic foot care, preventing falls, strength training, staying active, managing diseases through nutrition, urinary issues, advance directives/power of attorney, caregiver burnout, caregiver support, and dementia.

New business consisted of changing two things in the by-laws. We voted to change "he" to "he/she" in Article 6 and to delete a sentence regarding a foundation because the foundation no longer exists.

Overall, we found the meeting to be very interesting and informative. They really stressed the need for different types of entertainment and the need for volunteers. So if you know anyone who would be interested, please spread the word!



First Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes

February 13th, 2023





Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by President Mark Henn at 6:31PM.

Devotions: Pastor Rebekah led an exercise to reflect on the hope that God brings to us and the First Lutheran congregation. Psalm 33.22 Let your steadfast love, O Lord, be upon us, even as we hope in you.

Visitor: None.

Approval of January minutes: Motion Made, seconded, and carried to approve the January minutes with the following correction: New Business C) to read "Approval of curtains between fellowship hall and sanctuary. Motion made and seconded to purchase curtains with money coming from the money market account. Motion carried "

New Business:

A. Elections

- a. Council President: Nominated Mark Henn and Jim Laird as council president candidates, Mark Henn was elected by blind ballot.
- b. Nominated Kevin Birschbach as council VP, motion to close VP nominations, seconded, and carried.
- c. Nominated Dar Cravillion as council Treasurer, motion to close nominations was seconded and
- d. Nominated Mali Beine as council Secretary, motion to close nominations was seconded and carried.
- B. Pastor and Mark notified council of appointment of Steve Macijeski to the Mutual Ministry Committee. Current committee makeup (two non-council members from each church) and purpose (currently under development/clarification) was noted.
- C. First and Grace Council Presidents, and Vice Presidents, has a virtual meeting with Bishop Anne over this week. Mark summarized the call and included a reminder for council members to maintain confidentiality.
- D. Finance Ministry
 - a. Treasurer reported: Finance ministry is reviewing credit card vendor options and assessing if there is a need for a documented credit card use policy.
 - b. Finance Ministry recommended Thrivent Choice Dollars be directed to the general operating fund unless otherwise designated by the donor. Motion was made to accept this proposal, motion was seconded, motion carried.
 - c. Finance Ministry recommended changing from continuing resolution C13.01.A.21 The Executive Committee shall have the primary responsibility in collaboration with the parish administrator for drafting an annual budget.
 - To continuing resolution C13.01.A.24 The Finance Ministry shall have the primary responsibility, in collaboration with bookkeeper and parish administrator, for drafting and annual budget. A motion was made to make this change to the continuing resolution, was seconded, and was
 - carried.
 - d. Motion was made to change the Counter Job Description to state "volunteer mileage" will be reimbursed if requested. Motion was seconded, motion carried.
- E. Upgrade Internet Speed: Current issues with service livestream are caused by limited bandwidth (pixilated or no picture). Lenny proposed upgrading the internet speed from the Orbi 4G to US Cellular 5G service. Approximately \$100 cost to transfer service, with no significant change to monthly rate thereafter. Motion made for Lenny to pursue change in service and installation of interior equipment. Motion seconded and carried.

Unfinished Business:

- 1. Mark shared winter fun day was well received.
- 2. Mark noted fellowship hall curtains have been installed.
- 3. Mark updated that floor installation was mostly complete and remaining edges will be finished when doors or curtains are installed.
- 4. Kevin is still in communication with blacktop installer.

Other Business:

- 1. Hall improvements will continue with door and cabinet painting.
- 2. Question/Discussion do we have members who would attend church more often if transportation assistance was offered? Pastor reported possibly two.
- 3. Additional square footage of carpet squares may allow for replacement in other office areas in the future.
- 4. The Finance Ministry proposed purchasing an additional module for our bookkeeping software to allow payroll transactions. This would eliminate current monthly cost to outsource payroll. Dar will confirm module cost for vote at next meeting. Expected return on investment of less than two months.

Reports:

Monthly Financials: Presented transaction history of general fund, dedicated fund, and reserve accounts. Motion made, seconded, and carried to approve financial reports as presented.

Finance Ministry: Last Meeting was 2/7/24. Next meeting 3/6/24 at 10:30 AM.

Archive Committee: Investigating potential need for document scanner.

Parish Council Committee: Next meeting March 18, 2024, with potential virtual component.

Noisy Bucket: February and March - LWR (includes personal care kits) April - Veterans Home at King. Please brainstorm additional ideas for 2024.

Children's Ministry: Endowment fund contributes 1/3 of camp cost, church contributes 1/3, parents/family asked to contribute 1/3. We do not want the parent/family contribution to be a roadblock. Dar will draft a letter alerting families to this opportunity and offering additional support upon request.

Worship-Technology: Lenny created a YouTube channel so the worship services can be uploaded and linked to the church's website.

M-Team: A proposed calendar for 2024 was presented. Next Event: March 31st Hot Continental Easter Breakfast.

Endowment: Endowments were joyfully distributed.

Property: No update.

Staff Reports:

Pastor: Pastor Rebekah has been very busy and we appreciate all her work.

Office or Custodian: Adjustments being made to account for larger carpeted area.

Adjourn: Motion to adjourn 8:40PM, seconded, carried. Next meeting: Tuesday March 12th, 2024 at 6:30PM. Pastor Rebekah led a closing prayer.
