It is hard to believe that in just a few weeks, my internship year will come to an end. It is amazing how fast time passes, but I can state that this time spent has been very significant in my lifetime. I am grateful for the opportunities I have been involved in, within these two congregations and within these surrounding communities. So many great memories, so many of God’s created people here that have touched my life that I will carry forward in my heart, and so much that I have learned.

I soon return to seminary for my final year, but I return as a changed student. A student who has witnessed, learned, grown, and gained confidence beyond anything I anticipated, and I have an affirming sense of knowing I have a good foundation to proceed into my final steps toward becoming a minister, as God has called me to become. Thank you all for your patience, love, and grace during my time here with you.

Is resting also time well spent? A time of fasting from the hustle of life that we live in. Taking a day to rest is frequently perceived as time wasted. Some of us want to thrive on that hustle. In my prior career, that was me. My spiritual practices classes have taught me to thrive through my resting time. Just as Elijah waited for God to pass by, God was not in the wind, or the earthquake, or the fire; the hustle of life. God came in a still soft voice, (1 Kings 19:11-13). I hear God’s voice most clearly and frequently in the stillness and quiet time of my mornings after my overnight time of rest.

If you don’t have a sabbatical practice of rest, give it a try for a few weeks and see if it sticks. Take a day to do something that helps you rejuvenate, to renew yourself, and refresh yourself to be your current best. Even if that is a day to be in your most comfy clothes, with your favorite beverage and food, and just reflect upon your favorite things that fill you with the most joy. Take time just for you and rest from your routine, so you can renew yourself and hear God’s still soft voice.

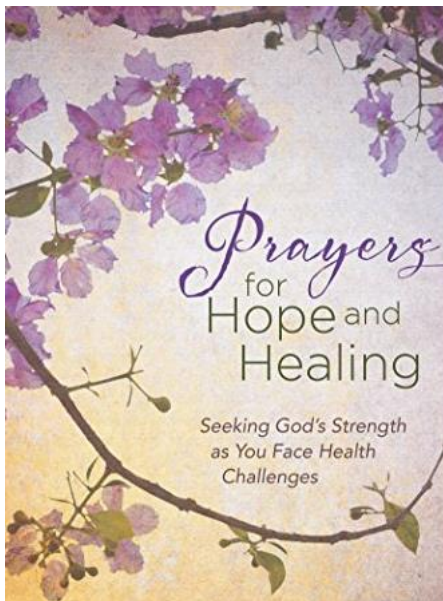

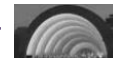

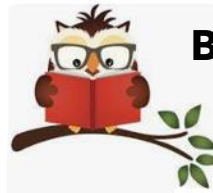

The Library Lion is busy this month prowling for the next book to feature for you, watch next month for a new review.

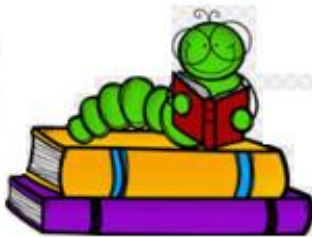


“Unbroken” A World War II Story of Survival, Resilience, and Redemption is a 2010 non-fiction book by Laura Hillenbrand.

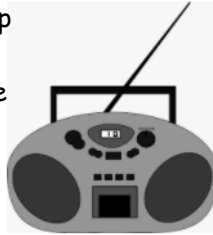

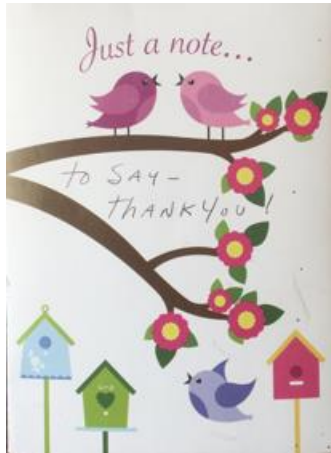

Would you consider becoming part of the Altar Guild?

Pastor Rebekah is seeking several more volunteers to be part of the Altar Guild. Ideally, we would have at least 24 people so that each person would only need to serve one month a year.

What is the Altar Guild?

The Altar Guild is a ministry of serving God in the house of worship. The altar guild prepares the Chancel (front of church) for worship each week. This includes setting up the sacraments of Holy Communion and Baptism, changing paraments and banners when needed, preparing the altar, and other details as needed for special events. Two people will be scheduled for each month to share the responsibilities.

Weekly Duties

- Check to see the paraments are the proper color, change as needed (see the colored calendar or check with the pastor if you have questions)
- Change banners as needed for the season or any special holy days (again see the posted calendar or check with the pastor)
- Prepare for and clean up after Holy Communion (step-by-step directions provided)
- Prepare for and clean up after Baptisms (directions provided)
- Fill candles
- Dust the altar area as needed
- Look around the altar area to be sure it is orderly and ready for worship
- Put distilled water in the small font.

If you would like to see the entire job description, Pastor Rebekah has copies available and one is posted in the sacristy. If you are willing to serve on the Altar Guild, please talk with Pastor Rebekah so we can get a schedule together.

What a difference a year makes...

After having just received what we believed to be a terminal diagnosis, I delivered my (3rd) precious baby boy on June 3rd, 2022. But it was merely four days after his arrival that so definitively marks the worst day of my life. I landed in the ICU for nearly two weeks after the surgery to place the chemotherapy port went horribly wrong, delaying the cancer treatments we already feared were too late to receive and abruptly separating me from my family in what I believed could be the final days we had left. I needed to undergo the additional obstacle of a major lung surgery that made me feel as though I was being held hostage from what we already believed was a Hail Mary pass at survival. I wanted to give up, but a visit from Dr. Susan Trocciola changed my doubt into hope. She's been by my side quite literally every step of the way, in the darkest moments and the sweetest victories. June 10th marked the one year anniversary of my surgery with Susan — a day quite honestly one year ago we thought may never come. Instead, it was a day filled with love and laughter and the miraculous words "no evidence of disease" among two breast cancer survivors as we shared a picnic lunch with my husband and sweet boys in a quiet park. A perfect day.
